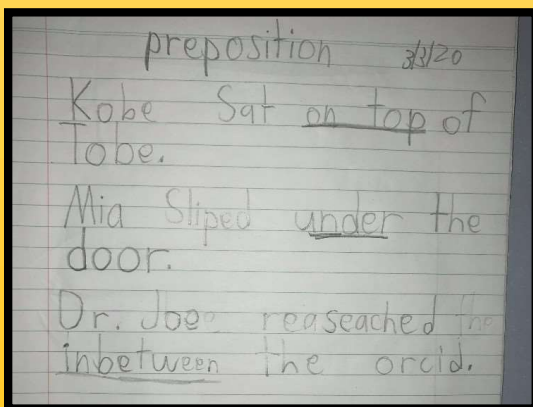
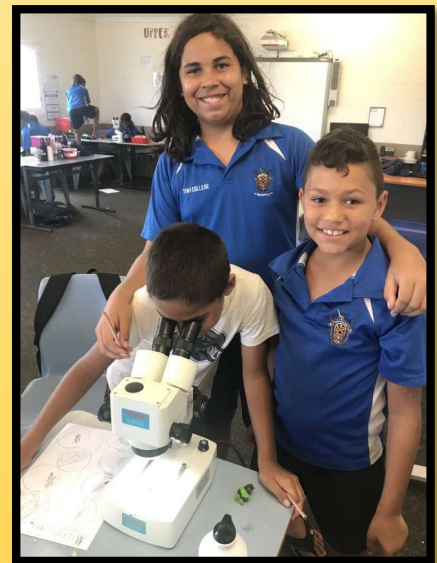


# Upper Primary Mob

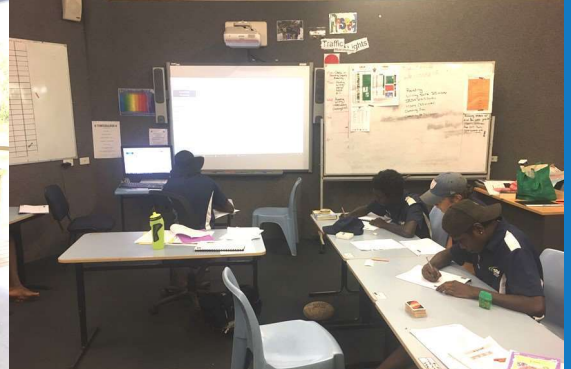
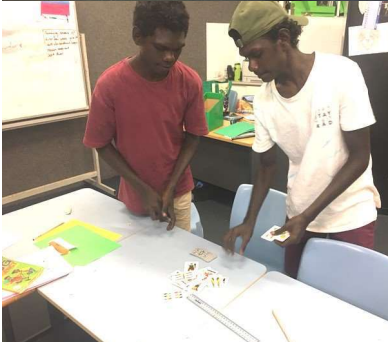
Students in the SYM class have made a fantastic start to their 2020 school year. Already I can see a great level of maturity and impressive work ethic among the students.
