This term teachers have continued on with their literacy and numeracy routines in the mornings and developed a variety of engaging topics and learning activities for the afternoon sessions including cooking, law and government, biology, chemistry, art and history. The English and Maths rotations and daily reading groups are having a positive impact on student progress with many students showing great improvements in their learning and confidence. The introduction of MiniLit and MacLit programs to support student literacy development has been a great addition to our academic program and will greatly assist students to gain the skills and knowledge they need to become proficient readers.

#### Junior Primary



#### Look what we are learning in Junior Primary

WOW! What a busy few weeks we have had in Junior Primary, with lots of learning going on! We were lucky to be a part of the Senior Girl's bake sale where we bought heaps of yummy cakes and desserts. We also received some super cool sunglasses from Guy Reynolds and learned about protecting our eye sight. Athletics day was also a huge highlight with so many students showing excellent sportsmanship which made me feel so proud.

During our Literacy sessions, we have now looked at all the alphabet names and sounds. We still recap these sounds daily to make sure that they stay in our memory. We have now begun to introduce diagraphs (two letters together make one sound). We have looked at qu, th, ch, sh and ai so far. We learn these through songs, flashcards and guided reading sessions.

We have been practising these sounds and brainstorming words that use these sounds. We have also been working on learning to read and write our high frequency words daily. We do this by building our words with magnetic letters, play doh, writing on whiteboards and using the iPads. The Senior girls have been coming into our classroom and reading with us and we have also been lucky enough to listen to some stories they wrote.

In Writing, we have been working hard on our letter formation and we have come so far from the beginning of the year. We have been practising writing basic sentences and stories using our sound knowledge to help write down words, and learning our high frequency words.

In Numeracy this term we have been working really hard on learning addition and subtraction. To do this we have been using number lines, counting forwards and backwards and using blocks. We have been practising counting by 2s, 5s and 10s and some of us have even been able to write these patterns down. Our number formation has improved so much from the beginning of the year with many of us able to write to at least 30.

We have also explored the topic of Measurement. We have looked at height, weight and capacity. We did a variety of different hands on activities to learn this. We also looked at ordinal numbers, focusing on first to twentieth. We have continued to participate in regular number fact sessions to enhance automatic recall of number facts and counting patterns. All students' have showed

growth in their progress and speed and I am super impressed with the results

shown.


