Stuart and Ashley finally leave Tiwi College this week after almost 6 years serving our students and school. We wish them all the best as they escape to COVID free Queensland.






I would like to thank all the hardworking and diligent FGH parents in their excellent teamwork with students and all other departments of Tiwi College and making Term 3, productive.

We also want to acknowledge and thank all the ancillary staff that support the students and academic staff, FGH parents, maintenance and hospitality.



What's been happening in Junior Primary in

Term 3

Wow! What a busy, fun filled term we have had in Junior Primary School. We were lucky to go to Milikapiti Primary School and participate in Athletics Day. I was so proud of the sportsmanship and effort shown during this day. We also were so lucky to celebrate Science week where we got to work in mixed groups and do lots of cool science experiments. We even got a visit and were able to practice and learn some touch rugby skills.









What we have been learning

Literacy

In Literacy we have been looking at Narratives. We have been reading lots of these stories and looking at characters, settings, problems and solutions. We have even had a go at writing our own narrative stories. We have been focusing on learning our diagraph sounds. We have looked at sh, ch, th, ng and ow. We have practiced reading and spelling words with these sounds. During our reading rotations we have been doing guided reading and practicing reading, saying and spelling our high frequency words.

Numeracy

We have a huge term learning Numeracy. We have been learning all about Australian Money. We have looked at putting Australian money in order from lowest to highest value. We have also looked at time where we have been focusing on learning how to tell o'clock and half past on a clock.

We have been continuing with our Blitzmaster program where each day we are given 8 minutes to complete addition and subtraction questions based on our

individual level. We have been working on learning and writing numbers to 300, saying and writing the days of the week in order and learning the months of the year.
