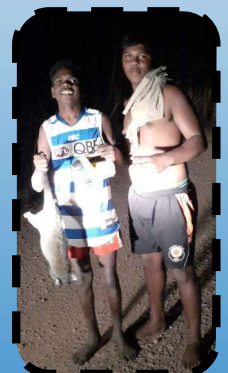
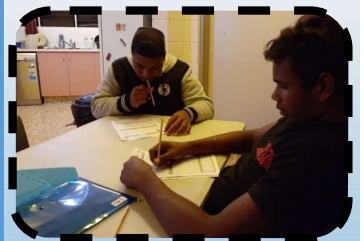
**Life skills**, was a combination of Academy (TLS) initiative, in conjunction with Academic and FGH's in re-enforcements:

## Term 3, 2020 in Japuja 5

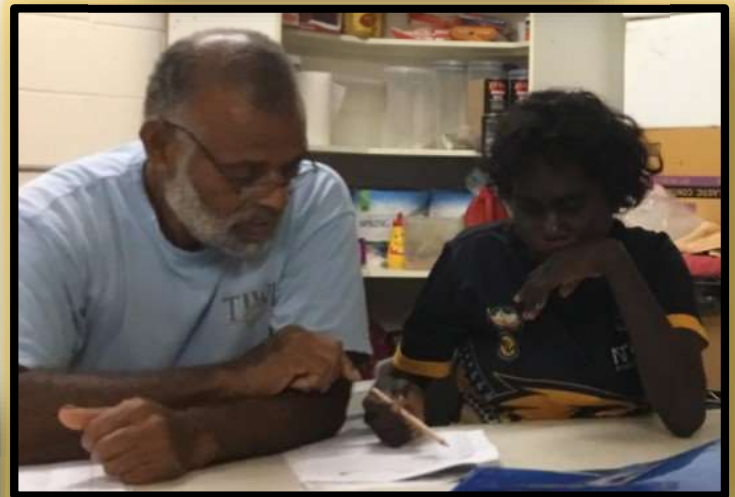
We have enjoyed sharing time with the FGH 5 girls. The girls have been good with homework each week doing their best to complete the work and take on help.

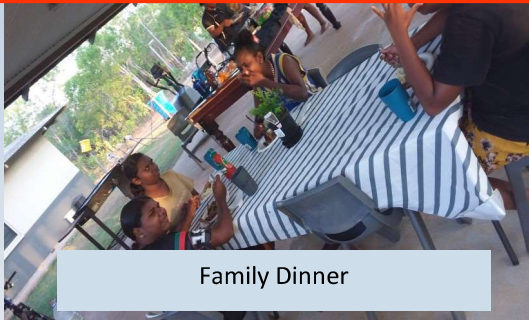




## FAMILY GROUP HOME 6

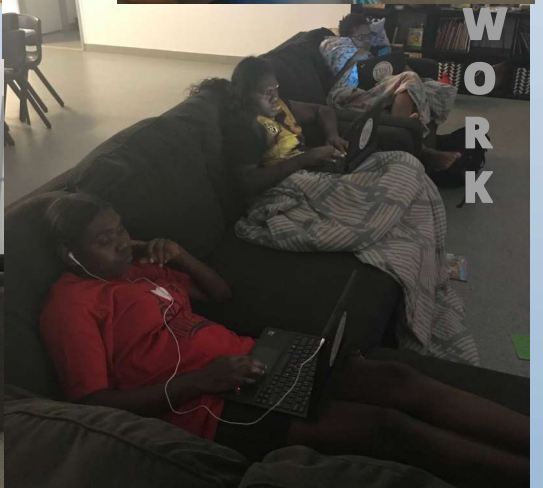
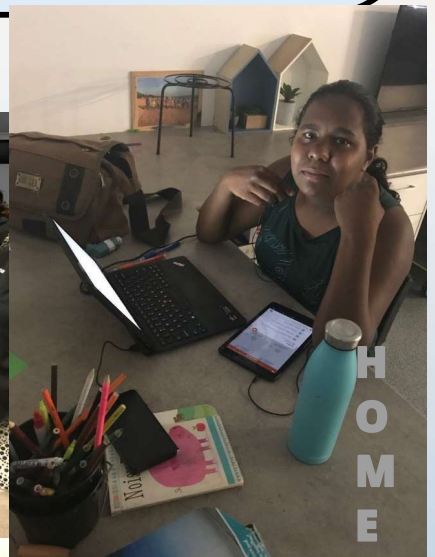

We have had consistently high numbers this term which has filled the house with noise and energy. In life skills we have focussed on different lessons based around elements of the student creed.

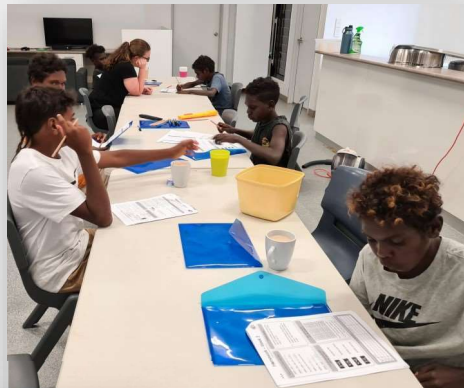

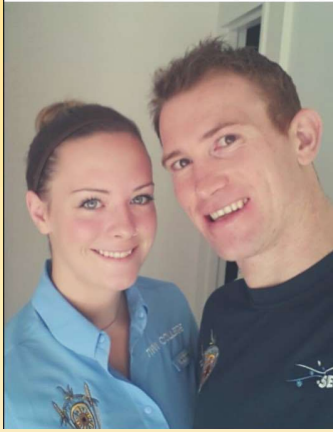

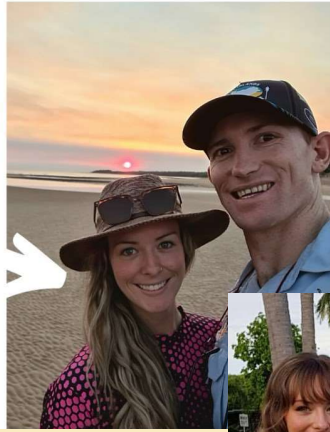




# Staff Farewell
