It is so hard to believe that we are so close to it being the end of the school year. I am so proud of all the hard work and effort all of my students have put in to their learning. In Literacy, we have been practicing all types of skills including sounding out and spelling new words, making predictions and writing responses about the texts we have read. Upper Primary students have been exploring their reading in more depth by looking at different text structures, writing summaries and making predictions using evidence. We have been reading independently, in small groups and online using Reading Eggs and Sunshine Online. On September 1st we celebrated Indigenous Literacy Day we were listened to many fantastic indigenous stories and we got to read some stories that were written in Tiwi.

In Math's sessions, we have been looking at factors of numbers, length and multiplication. We have been working on learning how measure items using our hands, feet and arms. We also practiced using rulers. In Upper Primary we have been exploring multiplication and division and how the two integrate. We have been learning about chance. We have also been doing online learning though Mathletics.

In Writing, we have been working on creating exciting stories. We have been writing our own stories based on Tiwi animals and are hoping to be able to use these to create our own book though the Indigenous Literacy Foundation.. The stories the students have produced have been excellent.

In Art, we have done a variety of different activities. We have been lucky to have Ruby help on board with a variety of different art techniques such as digital art and drawing.




