We were sad to see Floyd go but are enjoying his legacy and I send a big thankyou to him and wish him well in his new job at the Botanic Gardens in Noosa. In addition to growing fruit and veg he has worked hard to set up the farm's tool kit. We have just 'ploughed' the market garden beds for the coming season with the our new 'Walking Tractor', a very valuable tool that saves time money, and muscle. We are now sowing and planting the crops for the wet season, including Eggplants, Cassava, Chilis, Cucumbers, Moringa, Sweet Potato, Snake Beans and Corn. We are sowing about half the market garden under 'Green Manures'. These are pea, bean and grass crops that enrich the soil and protect it from the rains. They will be dug back in towards the end of the rains to make way for more veg crops in early 2021. Hopefully Term 1 and 2 will then see us delivering bountiful fresh food to your doors.

We also hope you'll join us in 2021 to learn more about how we do what we do.


